DEVELOPING THE NEXT GENERATION OF **FILM PROGRAMMERS** AND **CURATORS**









ABOUT

With the support of Screen Ireland, **Dublin International Film Festival** has developed **Irish Film Curators** – a new programme for up to 15 early career film curators to develop their skills. The programme, running July-September, provides participants with all they need to know to plan and promote their own screening event.

During the programme participants will work as a team and receive mentoring from professional film curators. The programme combines online learning through the 'Curate-It' app alongside in person meetings with the cohort and programme leaders.

At the end of the programme participants will curate and promote a film season at the Light House cinema in Dublin.

The programme is aimed at beginners or those with intermediate knowledge of film curation

Upon completion participants will be able to:

- Critically analyse films they want to curate
- Understand the theories and practices of film curation
- Negotiate rights to films
- Develop marketing strategies
- Create budgets and funding applications
- Implement screenings and events
- Monitor and evaluate events
- Screen events online and/or in real life



COMMITMENT

Participants are expected to commit to the full 14 week course, including at least one of the in-person screening days as part of the final curated film season in September.

Each session will last approx. 2hrs. Most of these will take place online.

Each participant will receive **€500** towards the cost of attending and participating in the programme.

The final film season will be screened at the **Light House Cinema (Dublin) from 27th - 29th September**

ELIGIBILITY

The role does not require any previous experience in film. Participants will work remotely, with some in-person meetings across the 14 weeks.

All candidates must be based in Ireland. Curate-It has been developed with the aim of democratising access to film curation by moving curatorial learning to the digital space.

We encourage applications from those who feel underrepresented due to race, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, age, class, or disability.
